Dear Friends,

First, thank you very much for supporting me on this second sabbatical. I am blessed to be your pastor and thankful for our ministry together. I appreciate your encouragement and prayers during this time of rest, growth, and reflection. During the sabbatical, God will teach me new things, refresh my soul, and deepen my faith, slowing me down to listen to His Spirit. My listening journey will begin at the Abbey of Gethsemani for several days, providing a good dose of silence.

One of my goals on this sabbatical is learning to be more of a pilgrim and less of a tourist. Often tourists are busy visiting places and checking off their to-do list. They accumulate photographs and list locations, saying, "Look where I

have been." My goal is to live more like a pilgrim, waiting and watching for new discoveries. I will certainly take photos, but be more attentive whether at the monastery, beach, traveling, Scotland, or sitting on the back porch. I want to ask deep questions like, "What is God saying? And where do I see God?

My second goal is reading and studying a variety of material. I will gain new insights about reading and studying the Bible. Authors like John Stott, Paul Achtemeier, George Guthrie, William Barclay, and John Burges will be my teachers. I, of course, will read on our Presbyterian history and John Knox before our wonderful trip to Scotland. My reading list will also include books on spiritual development, discernment, and the Benedictine way of living.

I will also interview several retired pastors seeking wisdom on how to finish well. My hope is to serve you until my retirement time and want these years to be my best. I have also been thinking about hospice ministry. Interviewing a hospice chaplain will deepen my understanding and ability to walk with people in grief and death.

Finally, there are some scriptures that have captivated my attention. I will think about verses like 2 Peter 3:18. Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen. What does it mean to grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ?

Someone gave me this prayer at the beginning of the last sabbatical. "Here's hoping you get loved more, heard more, discover more, and find more from God's influence than you ever dreamed. May you find God's sweet spot in this new season of ministry in the power of the resurrected Savior." All I can say is "Amen."

Please remember to contact Linda with any questions or pastoral care concerns. We have several church members ready to make house and hospital visits. All the regular programs will continue. Please remember to remain engaged in worship and missions. Where does God want you to serve in the church and world?


